EXTERNAL REVIEW

Our school external review has been completed and we have been given four directives to follow in the next four years. Our directives and report are on our website for all parents and community to access. I will be discussing our directives at our Governing Council meeting next Wednesday 17th August 2016, 645pm. SCHOOL MOTTO AND THE 100 YEARS CELEBRATION

Classes have all written a school motto for our school and we are now looking for community ideas on what our school motto could be. I have attached the mottos presented so far. If you have a motto that you like please pass it to me or the front office, prior to the Governing Council meeting. At the meeting the Governing Council members will submit their motto for the school. Later in the term the School Community parents and students will officially vote in their favourite motto.

SCHOOL SAFETY DATA:

Last term we conducted our School Safety Audit with all the students. The survey was to investigate whether or not students are safe in the school, yard and classroom.

90% of students indicated that they were most times or always safe in our school environment. This is a pleasing result. Students also indicated that 60% of the time they are able to solve yard issues with 60 % of the students seeking teacher assistance to help with the issue. Our challenge now is to maintain and increase the level of safety in the yard and to increase the skills levels of the students in conflict resolution.

NATIONALLY CONSISTENT COLLECTION OF DATA ON SCHOOL STUDENTS WITH DISABILITY

We have commenced the annual nationally consistent collection of data on school students with disability ('the Collection').

This will involve the collection of:

- the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- the level of adjustment provided to students; and where known, the student's type of disability.

Under the Collection model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information about your child will be included in this year's data collection.

WHAT IS GROWTH MINDSET?

A growth mindset is having the belief that we can continually grow in our learning, that we are not limited by how intelligent we are, our age, our background or what our parents were good at or not. If we have a growth mindset, we believe that with work, practice and perseverance, we can all improve.

A growth mindset can be developed in our children by focussing on their efforts, encouraging them to persevere with tasks no matter how difficult they are and praising them for the effort they give tasks rather than just the final result or answer. A Growth Mindset can also be developed by using the word YET – instead of "I can't do this, add the word yet to turn the statement into "I can't do this YET!"

Staff are participating in training this term to develop Growth Mindsets. Last week Raelene White presented to staff our Resilience data that she will be presenting to the Student Voice Committee. She showed us a video from Carol Dweck about the power of YET. Ask your child about what they are doing to build growth mindsets in their class. And ask yourself where you can insert the word "YET" into your child's vocabulary...Google Carol Dweck.
